

BRITISH YOUNG DRIVERS' NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Royal Estate, Sandringham, Norfolk

29 June - 1 July 2018

The 2018 Championship is running on the 2017 format. A National level driver will enter their usual national class. The penalties they gain in that class for dressage and marathon will be allocated to their class for the Junior National Championship. They will drive the cones course as set for their national class, but the penalties recorded for the Junior National Championships will be based on open class speeds for their respective class.

Those not yet driving at nationals should enter the Young Driver class.

Please ensure entries are submitted on the Young Drivers National Championships entry form. This will double as the entry form for the usual National class.

Classes: (Age - is determined by the age of the driver and groom on **31st December 2018** e.g. if a young driver is born at any time in 2002, they will be deemed to be age 16 for any event in 2018.)

Class 1	10-11 years	Singles
Class 2	12-14 years	Singles
Class 3	15-18 years	Singles
Class 4	19-25 years	Singles
Class 5	12-25 years	Multiples
Class 6	12-25 years	Young Driver Class

Qualification:

Open to any driver aged 10-25 years old, provided that they have completed two affiliated club three phase events in the previous 12 months without being eliminated or retiring, or have been assessed at the Easter or Summer camps. *Competitors must download a Driver Competence Form (for Novices & National multiples drivers) from the British Carriagedriving web-site or obtain a copy from the BC Office and get it signed by the Club Secretary, the Technical Delegate and the Dressage Judge at each event, or must produce a written assessment from the Training Clinics.*

RULES

Competitors should have a copy of the BC Rule Book. Not knowing the rules is not a defence when an infringement has taken place.

Important reminders:

1. All Competitors in the British Young Drivers' National Championships must be Young Driver or Associate Members of British Carriagedriving.
2. Drivers 13 years and under **must** have a groom aged 21 years or over. The groom must be competent and have participated at club or national events as a driver or groom, evidence of which will be required.
3. Drivers 14-18 years, must have a groom aged 18 years or over. The groom must be competent and have participated at club or national events as a driver or groom, evidence of which will be required.
4. Drivers and Grooms **must** wear BHS approved hard hats for exercising plus back/body protectors for the marathon phase. Drivers and Grooms 18 years and under **must** wear BHS approved hard hats and back/ body protectors throughout the entire competition.
5. The vehicle must fit the driver. The driver must be able to brace themselves between a solid foot rest and the back of the seat.
6. Competitors in Class 1 (10-11 years) may use a vehicle with a minimum 125 cm track width in all phases.
7. 10 year olds may only drive a single turnout.
8. 11-13 year olds may drive a single or pair.
9. 14-25 year olds may drive any turnout.
10. To qualify to drive a pair, a driver must have competed at three affiliated club three phase events without being eliminated or retiring. Drivers may only drive a tandem or four-in-hand after having been assessed. Two grooms are required with a four-in-hand turnout.
11. Drivers must, at all times, respect their horse / pony and retire at any time if the animal is distressed.
12. Competitors are reminded that helpers appreciate a courteous attitude and your thanks.
13. Subject to conditions – small pony times may be given on the marathon, if requested, for ponies 11 hh and under. Scores of ponies claiming these times will not be eligible for team results. Requests will only be considered from competitors who have not competed at National Events.

PAYMENT

- **The Entry fee, payable to the event organiser**
- **The Start fee, payable to British Carriagedriving**

COMPETITION ENTRY FEES

Each event sets their own entry fees, which are given in the schedule.

Please make cheques payable to the event, as shown in the schedule.

No acknowledgement of your entry will be made unless a stamped addressed envelope is enclosed.

START FEES

You must pay the start fee **AT THE SAME TIME AS YOUR ENTRY FEE.**

Enclose a separate cheque, payable to "British Carriagedriving".

If you are unable to start at the event, your start fee cheque will be returned to you.

PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

If the driver is under 18 years of age, the name of a responsible adult (over 18) who will be able to attend in case the driver's horse(s) are selected for drug testing, must be given on the entry form.
