Prizes:	Prizes for Best Shod Horse will be awarded (classes tbc). The Pentonbridge Inn Trophy will be awarded to the driver with the lowest combined overall score at Hopetoun and Bywell in 2019 (3 phases to count at Hopetoun, Dressage & Marathon at Bywell) The Worshipful Company of Saddlers will present a training voucher to each para driver and young driver (as stipulated for British Carriagedriving Young Members) who completes 3 National or Regional events in one calendar year (the National Championships may count as one of the events). Multiple prizes will not be awarded.
Stabling:	Please report to the stable manager on arrival and wait to be directed to a parking area. Rubber matting must be used on all stables and corrals. Electric fencing can be used with prior arrangement with the event organiser and there will be a designated parking area.
Stabling Hire:	Please notify the Entries Secretary of stabling requirement, and any additional shavings required on site, when entering for the event. A payment of £100 per stable should be included with your entry fee (includes 1 x large bale shavings). Refund of £10 for stables left mucked out satisfactorily. Competitors MUST provide matting for use in temporary stables.
Electric Hook-up:	Please notify Entries Secretary of electric hook up requirement when entering for the event and include payment of £70 with your entry fee.
Marathon Information:	Section A of approximately 7k of undulating forest tracks and farmland; 1k Transfer; 8k Section B with 8 obstacles within the Deer Park, including 2 with water. Novice and Club classes will drive 6 obstacles.
Additional vehicles:	£10 per extra caravan, after the first one per competitor.
ATVs/Scooters:	May be used to access the forward parking area at the obstacles at competitors' risk. Not to be used in the obstacles as per BC rules.
Dogs:	Dogs on leads only.
Catering:	Full catering plus bar on site from Thursday. Drinks reception on Friday evening, following Terrier Racing. Prize Giving and Ceilidh on Saturday evening.
Vet/Farrier:	Vet: Royal (Dick) School of Veterinary Studies. Farrier: Darren Muir. Please contact Stable Manager for phone numbers and referral..
Location:	Deer Park, Hopetoun Estate, Newton, Winchburgh, West Lothian, EH30 9SL. A904, via A90 or M9. In the village of Newton, turn north down the road signposted to Abercorn Church; pass the Parkhead Cottages on a narrow Z bends, ¼ mile further on turn right into the Deer Park through the security gates over a cattle grid. The Stable Manager's Office is 300 yards straight on from the gates, please wait there to be directed.

INTERNATIONAL SELECTION CLASSES

A completed International Team Selection Form must be forwarded to the British Carriagedriving Office prior to the event or, at the very latest, be handed to a British Carriagedriving Council Member prior to you starting at your first selection event, i.e. this must be before you begin your Dressage Test! (Selection Forms can be downloaded from the web site or obtained from your Class Representative).

PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

If the driver is under 18 years of age, the name of a responsible adult (over 18) who will be able to attend in case the driver's horse(s) are selected for drug testing, must be given on the entry form.
