

British Carriagedriving INSTRUCTIONS FOR GROUND OBSERVERS

Please note all penalties will be awarded by scorers.

- 1. Ground Observers must record on the Score Card the following:
- (a) If a Compulsory Turning Flag has not been passed on the correct side or in the correct sequence, red on right, white on left. All Grooms must be on the Vehicle when it passes through the Compulsory Turning Flag.
- (b) If an Athlete deviates from the Course between the Last Obstacle and the Finish of Section B. If an Athlete stops, other than within 30 metres of the Last Obstacle, to make repair.
- (c) Breaks of pace required paces are:

Section A Any Pace. Section Transfer Any Pace.

Section B Any Pace – except between the last Obstacle and the Finish when the pace must

be Walk or Trot

For a break of pace, only one Horse need break. Each period of 5 seconds that a break of pace continues, must be recorded.

- (d) Halts are allowed for an accident or repair to harness or vehicles. The time of any halts should be recorded.
- (e) Grooms may leave the Vehicle at any time in any Section (outside the Obstacles) without incurring penalties provided that the Vehicle is stationary, but must be on board passing through Numbered Flags.
- 2. The only person to handle the Reins, Whip or Brake on the Vehicle is the Athlete. Any assistance in this respect given by Grooms will entail 20 penalties. (Grooms may give assistance to the Athlete preventing him from falling out of the Vehicle but they may not hold his arm or interfere with his driving or for any other reason.) Grooms may pass the Athlete a spare whip without penalty. If the Vehicle is stationary the Groom may handle the Reins without penalty.
- 3. Ground Observers must report any outside assistance, this includes the following:
- a) Being followed or accompanied by any vehicle, bicycle, pedestrian or horseman.
- b) Advice or directions from friends, spectators, Obstacle Observers, or Officials as to the condition of the going, time or distance.
- c) Having someone at an Obstacle to encourage or assist an Athlete or Horses by any means whatsoever.
- d) The use of electronic communication equipment on the Vehicle, except between Sections.
- 4. Ground Observers must report any deliberate acts of cruelty such as excessive use of the whip or excessive pressing of exhausted Horses. They must report any such acts to a Member of the Ground Jury at the first opportunity after the incident.
- 5. Ground Observers must remain within easy reach of the public address system until officially released by the President of the Jury or his representative.
- 6. Ground Observer Score Cards will be collected by the Score Collectors.
