Neutral section between Sections A and B. 8 obstacles within the Deer Park, including 2 water obstacles. National Novice and Small Equine classes will drive 6 obstacles. VSE and Pre-Novice will drive 4 obstacles including 1 water obstacle. Maximum 4km. Distances to be confirmed.</p>
Additional vehicles:	<p>£10 per extra caravan, after the first one per competitor.</p>
ATVs/Scooters:	<p>May be used to access the obstacles at competitors’ risk. Not to be used in the obstacles as per BC rules. No cars beyond the forward (obstacle) parking area.</p>
Dogs:	<p>Dogs on leads at all times. No dogs in obstacles. Please clear up and bin all dog waste.</p>
Health and Safety:	<p>Health & Safety standards will be enforced. All persons on the showground or course will be held responsible for complying with these standards at all times and must not put themselves or any other person at risk in any way whatsoever.
