### **Art. 911.2, British Carriagedriving Rules for Horse Driving Trials**

1<sup>st</sup> January 2022

Where there is abuse of the Horses in any form or incorrect behaviour towards Event Officials or any other party connected to the Event; The President of the Ground Jury, the Technical Delegate or the Steward, if appointed under Article 911, instead of instituting the procedures foreseen in the Legal System, may deliver to the Person Responsible, either by hand or by any other suitable means, a Yellow Warning Card.

Should the same Person Responsible receive one (1) more Yellow Warning Card at the same or any other National or Regional event within one year of the delivery of the first Yellow Warning Card, the Person Responsible shall be automatically suspended for a period of two (2) months immediately following the event at which the Person Responsible is competing. British Carriage Driving Council shall be responsible to notify the Person Responsible of such suspension.

### **Art. 911.2, British Carriagedriving Rules for Horse Driving Trials**

1<sup>st</sup> January 2022

Where there is abuse of the Horses in any form or incorrect behaviour towards Event Officials or any other party connected to the Event; The President of the Ground Jury, the Technical Delegate or the Steward, if appointed under Article 911, instead of instituting the procedures foreseen in the Legal System, may deliver to the Person Responsible, either by hand or by any other suitable means, a Yellow Warning Card.
